Throat Collection Tip Sheet

Specimen


The preferred specimen is an ESwab with a flocked swab. The sample must have an affixed specimen label after collection.


Materials

- Throat Swab (ESwab with flocked swab)
- Tongue Depressor
- Biohazard Bag
- PPE

Procedure

- 1. Identify the patient.
- 2. Wash hands or use antimicrobial hand gel.
- 3. Put on proper PPE.
- 4. Explain the collection procedure to the patient.
- 5. Remove the ESwab from the packaging making sure not to contaminate the swab by touching anything with the exposed swab.
- 6. Have the patient open their mouth wide, say "AHH," and stick out their tongue. Using the tongue depressor, press the tongue down and out of the way.
- Insert the swab into the mouth until the swab touches the back of the mouth/throat area. Swab the area around the tonsils focusing on any puss pockets, red, or inflamed areas. Do not touch the tongue, uvula, or cheeks.







- 8. After swabbing the area(s), place the swab into the tube.
- 9. Label the specimen in the presence of the patient and place into a biohazard bag.
- 10. Remove PPE.
- 11. Wash hands or use antimicrobial hand gel.
