Understanding Your Laboratory Tests <u>Timed, Hourly Urine Specimen Collections</u>

Some conditions require that an Hourly urine specimen be collected for testing so that kidney function can be accurately evaluated. Collection periods can be 2, 12, or 24 hr but the most common collection period is for 24 Hours.

<u>Please note the collection period required</u> <u>for your particular test!</u>



- Your physician has asked you to provide a timed urine specimen for testing, you can help ensure the accuracy of these tests by following these instructions:
- Avoid alcoholic beverages, vitamins, and other medications (if possible) for at least 24-hours before you start collecting the specimen and during the collection period. CONSULT YOUR PHYSICIAN BEFORE YOU DISCONTINUE ANY MEDICATION.
- 2) The specimen container you have been given may have a preservative in it. Do not dispose of the preservative and be

sure to keep the container out of the reach of children.

- Do not exceed your normal intake of liquids during the day before and during the collection unless your physician gives you specific directions to do otherwise.
- 4) The collection period begins when you get up in the morning and empty your bladder. DO NOT COLLECT THIS URINE, but do record the <u>TIME</u> and <u>DATE</u> of this voiding on the specimen container label. This is the start time of the collection.
- 5) Be sure to collect ALL urine day and night for the duration of the collection.
- 6) Keep the specimen refrigerated during the collection period.
- Bring the entire specimen, labeled with your name, dates, and start and end times, to the nearest UM Shore Regional Health Laboratory draw site location as soon as possible after completion of the collection.
