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TITLE: SYRINGE VENIPUNCTURE METHOD

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Weak or fragile veins may cause unsuccessful venipunctures with evacuated tubes. In these cases a syringe might be helpful.

Procedure:

- 1. Perform the same preparation technique as with the routine venipuncture.
- 2. Remove the needle and syringe from their sterile wrapper.
- 3. Secure the needle on the syringe. Do not remove the needle cover.
- 4. Pull on the syringe plunger to see that is moves freely.
- 5. Make sure that the plunger is pushed all the way forward before attempting to draw the specimen.
- 6. Enter the vein, bevel up, as with a routine venipuncture.
- 7. When you see blood enter the hub of the needle, release the tourniquet.
- 8. Slowly pull back on the plunger and allow the barrel of the syringe to fill with blood.
- 9. When adequate volumes of blood have been collected remove the needle.
- 10. Use a needle transfer device to transfer blood to the collection tubes.
