<ul> <li>Instructions:</li> <li>Trauma TEG availability: 24 hours/day</li> <li>Please call the lab at #8745, 15 minutes before sending the sample (instrument calibration).</li> <li>The specimen must be WALKED to the lab and handed directly to the technician.</li> <li>Do NOT place specimen on ICE.</li> <li>Do NOT tube the specimen and do not place the specimen in any container in the lab.</li> <li>Rejection criteria: wrong tube type, improperly filled, insufficient sample, clotted sample, mislabeled sample, sample sent via pneumatic tube, sample sent on ice, sample older than 2 hours</li> </ul>

<b>Phlebotomy Considerations:</b> Draw sample in blue top citrated tubes (3 mL) to arrow mark; gently invert several times to prevent clotting. If possible, use 21 gauge or larger needle to minimize platelet activation and hemolysis.  ☐ Arterial Sample (10 mL waste drawn prior to sample draw)					
□ Venous Sample (10 mL waste drawn prior to sample draw) □ Venous Sample (Venipuncture: use 21 gauge or larger and draw 3 cc waste. CVL: use double stop-cock technique and draw 10 cc waste.)					
Sample Type  ☐ 1 - 3.2% Sodium Citrate blue top tubes (3 mL each) preferred – minimum 1 blue top tube (2 mL)
