Re: Hematology Critical Value policy change

Starting on December 10<sup>th</sup>, the Hematology department will be changing how critical values for hemoglobin (Hgb), hematocrit (Hct), platelet count (Plt), white blood count (WBC) and the absolute neutrophil count (ANC) are called. Hemoglobin, hematocrit and platelet count will be called first time within 24 hours. White blood count and the absolute neutrophil count will be called first time within 48 hours.
